

# **Recipes**

## **Prosperity Oil**

10 parts Frankincense5 parts Myrrh1 part Cinnamon10 parts sandalwood

Use pure essential oils When making anointing oils, be sure to dilute essential oils with at LEAST 10 to 20 times as much carrier oil (such as olive oil, grape seed oil Jojoba oil, etc). The oil should be LIGHTLY scented, not highly perfumed.

## **Prosperity Incense**

10 parts powdered sandalwood

1 part powdered cinnamon

10 parts frankincense resin

5 parts myrrh.

A few drops of essential oils of frankincense, myrrh and/or cinnamon as you desire

Grind in a mortar and pestle until the resins are powdered and incorporated into the powdered wood as much as possible. Mix the essential oils last until well incorporated.

Burn over hot incense coals or in an electric incense burner.

#### **Success Incense**

10 parts powdered sandalwood

- 1 part powdered orris root
- 1 part powdered allspice
- 1 part powdered myrrh
- 1 part benzoin resin

A few drops oil of rose and oil of patchouli.

Grind until the resins are ground and incorporated into the powdered woods, herbs, and spices. Mix the essential oils last until well incorporated.

Burn over hot incense coals or in an electric incense burner.

#### **Money Oil**

- 1 part pine oil
- 1 part bergamot oil
- 5 parts jasmine oil
- 3 parts lavender oil
- 2 parts patchouli oil

Dilute by 20 times in almond oil. Place a few pieces of bayberry bark in the bottle

## **Money Incense**

- 10 parts powdered sandalwood
- 1 part powdered cinnamon
- 3 parts dried lavender
- 1 pinch of fenugreek powder
- 2 parts dried peppermint leaves
- 3 parts tonka beans
- 5 parts frankincense resin
- 1 part bayberry bark
- 2 raw almonds (unsalted)
- a few drops each: oils of patchouli, lavender, and bergamot.

Grind all the ingredients as close to a powder as possible. (Note that you won't be able to powder the tonka beans by hand; use a mill or blender.) Mix the essential oils in last until well incorporated.

Burn on hot incense coals or in an electric incense burner

When compounding incense, make sure to place the powdered woods and herbs in your mortar first. Then, add the gums and resins and grind them into the powder. Add your oils last and mix until well incorporated. Myrrh is a very hard resin, so consider using powdered myrrh. You can also put the gums and resins in the freezer overnight before trying to powder them to make the process easier. Alternatively, you can use a mill or coffee grinder to grind your ingredients first, but be careful not to heat the gums, as they will soften and literally "gum up" your mill.

IMPORTANT: Remember that the oil, incense, and candles are NOT the most important; the work is what truly matters. Don't confuse the tools with the work. You can perform effective magic with nothing but your mind, your voice, and, if necessary, a pen and paper. If you seek effective incense but prefer not to make recipes, use plain frankincense. It's one of the most powerful incenses available. Plain olive oil is one of the most potent anointing oils you can find.
